

God Defends Jerusalem

King James Bible Crossword Puzzle

2 Kings 18 and 19 tell the story of God's great salvation of Jerusalem in the days of King Hezekiah and the prophet Isaiah. Highlights of the story from the King James Version of the Bible are told below.

Follow the story in a King James Bible. Find the missing words and complete the crossword puzzle.

The same missing words are used in the ESV, NIV and NKJV versions, but the translations are different.

<u>2 Kings 18</u>

Now it came to pass in the third year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel, that (27 across) the son of (39 across) king of (15 down) began to reign. Twenty and five years old was he when he began to (11 down); and he reigned twenty and nine years in (30 across). His mother's name also was Abi, the daughter of Zachariah.

And he did that which was <u>(23 down)</u> in the sight of the LORD, according to all that David his father did. ... He <u>(24 across)</u> in the LORD God of Israel; so that after him was none like him among all the kings of Judah, nor any that were before him. ... And the <u>(31 across)</u> was with him; and he prospered whithersoever he went forth: and he <u>(25 down)</u> against the king of <u>(2 down)</u>, and served him not.

Now in the <u>(40 across)</u> year of king Hezekiah did <u>(19 down)</u> king of Assyria come up against all the fenced cities of Judah, and took them. ... And the king of Assyria sent Tartan and Rabsaris and Rabshakeh from Lachish to king Hezekiah with a great host against Jerusalem. And they went up and came to Jerusalem. And when they were come up, they came and stood by the conduit of the <u>(4</u> <u>across, two words)</u>, which is in the highway of the fuller's field. ... Then Rabshakeh <u>(3 across)</u> and cried with a loud voice in the Jews' language, and spake, saying, <u>(12 across)</u> the word of the great king, the king of Assyria: Thus saith the king, Let not Hezekiah <u>(18 down)</u> you: for he shall not be able to <u>(41</u> <u>across)</u> you out of his hand: Neither let Hezekiah make you <u>(38 across)</u> in the LORD, saying, The LORD will surely deliver us, and this <u>(29 across)</u> shall not be delivered into the hand of the king of Assyria.

But the <u>(5 down)</u> held their peace, and answered him not a word: for the king's commandment was, saying, <u>(32 down)</u> him not.

<u>2 Kings 19</u>

So the servants of king Hezekiah came to <u>(33 across)</u>. And Isaiah said unto them, Thus shall ye say to your <u>(20 down)</u>, Thus saith the LORD, Be not <u>(22 across)</u> of the <u>(1 down)</u> which thou hast heard, with which the servants of the king of Assyria have blasphemed me. Behold, I will send a blast upon him, and he shall hear a rumour, and shall return to his own land; and I will cause him to fall by the <u>(8 down)</u> in his own land.

And Hezekiah <u>(36 down)</u> before the LORD, and said, O LORD God of <u>(34</u> <u>down)</u>, which dwellest between the cherubims, thou art the God, even thou alone, of all the <u>(17 across)</u> of the earth; thou hast made <u>(7 down)</u> and <u>(6 across)</u>. LORD, bow down thine ear, and hear: open, LORD, thine eyes, and see: and hear the words of Sennacherib, which hath sent him to reproach the <u>(16 across)</u> God.

Then Isaiah the son of Amoz sent to Hezekiah, saying, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, That which thou hast prayed to me against Sennacherib king of Assyria I have <u>(35 down)</u>. ... Therefore thus saith the LORD concerning the king of Assyria, He shall not come into this city, nor shoot an <u>(9 across)</u> there, nor come before it with shield, nor cast a bank against it. By the way that he <u>(29 down)</u>, by the same shall he <u>(10 across)</u>, and shall not come into this city, saith the LORD. For I will <u>(37 across)</u> this city, to <u>(21 down)</u> it, for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

And it came to pass that night, that the <u>(28 across)</u> of the LORD went out, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all <u>(13 across)</u> corpses. So Sennacherib king of Assyria departed, and went and returned, and dwelt at <u>(14 down)</u>. And it came to pass, as he was worshipping in the house of Nisroch his god, that Adrammelech and Sharezer his <u>(26 down)</u> smote him with the sword: and they escaped into the land of Armenia. And Esarhaddon his son reigned in his stead.
