Focus Points

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"Focus Points" are short activities that draw students into the lesson. They take only a few minutes to do. Many can be used as quick-start activities to engage the students and focus their attention at the beginning of class. Others may fit well during the lesson to reinforce a point and drive it home. Still others may serve as good wrap-up activities. "Focus Points" come in many forms. Choose and use them as you see fit.

For example:

- The following activity can be used when you begin your studies of Abraham to introduce important people you will meet in the lessons to come.
- It can be used at a strategic point during the studies of his life.
- Or it can be used at the end of the studies as a quick review.

The activity comes in three forms: (1) = a set of verbal questions; (2) and (3) = pencil and paper versions of the same name game.

Focus Point – Who's Who in Abraham's Family?

(1) Verbal questions about Abraham's family. Add or change names as needed.
