Focus Points


"Focus Points" are short activities that draw students into the lesson. They take only a few minutes to do. Many can be used as quick-start activities to engage the students and focus their attention at the beginning of class. Others may fit well during the lesson to reinforce a point and drive it home. Still others may serve as good wrap-up activities. "Focus Points" come in many forms. Choose and use them as you see fit.

For example:

- This activity can be used as a quick *pretest* to determine what your students know before you study Paul's second missionary journey. Give them a few minutes to write the answers on their papers and then go over the questions to see how they have done. Go over the questions again at the end of the lesson to see if they can correct any mistakes they made.
- The activity can also be used as a *posttest* or any time you want to find out how much they remember about Paul's second journey.
