
Bible Baseball

Bible Baseball is an active indoor game that can be played several ways depending on how many players you have. Set up chairs to create a playing area:



Use questions with four levels of difficulty: single, double, triple, and home run. Suggestion: write each set of questions on a separate page. When batters comes to the plate (moving from the **Dugout** to chair **H**), they choose the level of question they want to try. The umpire (**U**) selects and asks the question. If the question is answered correctly, the batter goes to the corresponding base (chair **1**, **2**, or **3**; a home run lets the batter "run the bases" and touch each chair). When the batter gets "a hit", players already on base move up the same number of chairs, scoring a run when they touch home (**H**). If the question is answered incorrectly, the batter is out and goes back to the **Dugout**. Bible baseball can be a fun way to review an entire year's worth of Sunday school lessons.

Ground rules. It probably won't be necessary to make many rules for Bible Baseball, but here is something for the umpire to keep in mind: (1) monitor the number of easy questions that a team tries to use up during each turn at bat, or (2) agree ahead of time that each team must try different levels of questions during its turn at bat.

Variations. (1) Play Bible Baseball with two bases instead of three. A two-base game makes it easier to score. It also works better with small teams. (2) Don't count the number of outs. Instead, a half inning ends when every player on a team has had a turn at bat. (3) If you have lots of players, form a third team. An inning lasts until all teams have had a turn at bat.

Bible Baseball – Early Acts

Here are a lot of single, double, triple, and homerun questions for the first twelve chapters of Acts. The questions cover Peter's role in the Great Commission and Saul's conversion. Several questions have multiple-part answers, giving players an opportunity to "steal" bases by answering extra parts of a question. But they are out if they go for an extra base and miss. Any time an answer is in doubt, read the Bible passage.

Single Questions

How long was Jesus seen by his apostles after he rose from the dead? *Answer – 40 days (Acts 1:3)*

Acts 1, the Great Commission. Name the places where Jesus commissioned his apostles to preach the gospel?

[Get a base for each place you can name in any order.]

Answer – Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, end of the earth (Acts 1:8)

What took Jesus out of sight when he ascended to heaven?

Answer – A cloud (Acts 1:9)

Who saw Jesus ascend into heaven?

Answer – Apostles (Acts 1:2); disciples (Acts 1:22); two men (angels) in white robes (Acts 1:10)

Name the apostles of Jesus who are identified in Acts 1.

[Get a base for every *two* you can name in any order.]

Answer – Peter, John, James, Andrew, Philip, Thomas, Bartholomew, Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, Judas the brother of James. (Acts 1:13)

Acts 1. Who became the leading apostle after the ascension of Jesus? Answer – Peter (Acts 1:15)

Acts 2. Name one of the places that people were from who heard the apostles speak in tongues on the day of Pentecost?

[Get a base for each of the first four places you can name.]

Answer – Parthians, Medes, Elamites, residents of Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, Asia, Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, Libya (Cyrene), Rome, Crete, Arabia (Acts 2:9-11a)

Acts 2. What apostle spoke on behalf of the 12 on the Day of Pentecost? *Answer – Peter (Acts 2:14)*

Who did the Jews betray and kill according to the plan and foreknowledge of God? Answer – Jesus (Acts 2:23)

What did God do because it was not possible for Jesus to remain dead? *Answer – Raise him up (Acts 2:24)* Where is Jesus exalted?

Answer – Right hand of God (Acts 2:33)

Acts 2. What did newly baptized believers devote themselves to as members of the Jerusalem church? I.e., what did they do when they met together?

[Get one base for each thing you can name in any order.]

Answer - Apostles' teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayers (Acts 2:42)

Acts 2. Who adds believers to the church on a daily basis?

Answer – The Lord (Acts 2:47)

Acts 2-5. What kinds of things did the apostles tell the Jews when they preached the gospel in Jerusalem?

[Get a base for each thing you can name.]

Answer – (1) They killed Jesus, (2) God raised Jesus from the dead, (3) God exalted Jesus, (4) Jesus = Lord/Christ/Holy One/Savior, (5) Jesus at the right hand of God until ..., (6) Repentance, conversion, baptism, forgiveness of sins, (7) Apostles = witnesses, Holy Spirit = witness (Acts 5:30-32; cp. Acts 2:22-24 and 32-36; Acts 3:13-21)

Acts 3. Name one apostle who met a lame man at the Beautiful Gate of the Temple.

[Steal second by naming both apostles who met the man.]

Answer – Peter, John (Acts 3:1)

Acts 3. What was the lame man doing at the Beautiful Gate of the Temple? *Answer – Asking for alms (Acts 3:2)*

Acts 3. Who went "walking and leaping and praising God" after he was healed? *Answer – Lame man (Acts 3:8)*

Who will send Jesus Christ back again? Answer – "The Lord" (God) (Acts 3:20)

Acts 4. What men did the rulers in Jerusalem recognize as the former companions of Jesus? *Answer – The apostles (Acts 4:13)*

Acts 5. How were Ananias and Sapphira related to each other? *Answer – Husband and wife (Acts 5:2, 9)*

Acts 5. What happened to Ananias after Peter convicted him of lying to God? Answer – He died (Acts 5:5-6)

[Steal an extra base: What happened to Sapphira for lying?

Answer – She died, too (Acts 5:10)]

By whose hands were signs and wonders done after the ascension of Jesus? *Answer – Apostles (Acts 5:12)*

Acts 5. Name one place in Jerusalem where the apostles preached the gospel to the Jewish people on a daily basis.

[Steal *third* base by naming a second place where they preached the gospel.]

Answer – Temple, private homes (Acts 5:42)

Acts 6. As the church grew, how many faithful men did the apostles appoint to distribute relief to the needy in Jerusalem? *Answer – Seven (Acts 6:3)*

Acts 6. Name one of the seven deacons (ministers) who took over the daily relief of needy believers in Jerusalem.

[Get an extra base for each additional deacon you can name.]

Answer – Stephen, Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, Nicolaus (Acts 6:5)

Acts 6. Stephen did more than just help needy believers in Jerusalem. What else did he do?

[Get a base for each thing you can name.]

Answer – (1) Wonders and signs (Acts 6:8); (2) Dispute with members of the synagogue of the Freedmen (Acts 6:9); (3) Preach under inspiration (Acts 6:10-11, 13-14); (4) Defend his faith before the Jewish council (Acts 6:12-7:2ff)

When Stephen went on trial, what did his face suddenly look like to the members of the Jewish council? *Answer – An angel (Acts 6:15)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. How much of the Promised Land did Abraham inherit in his lifetime?

Answer – "Not even a foot's length" (Acts 7:5)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Who fathered the twelve patriarchs of Israel? Answer – Jacob (Acts 7:8)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Out of jealousy, who did the "patriarchs" sell into slavery in Egypt? Answer – Joseph (Acts 7:9)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Who did God rescue out of all his afflictions and make a ruler over Egypt? Answer – Joseph (Acts 7:10)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Why did Jacob send "our fathers" to Egypt? *Answer* – "*No food"* (*Acts 7:11*), "*there was grain in Egypt"* (*Acts 7:12*)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. How many times did Joseph's brothers go to Egypt to buy food? *Answer – Two (Acts 7:12-13)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Who did Joseph invite to come live in Egypt?

[Either part of the answer = single; steal second with both parts.]

Answer – Jacob his father, all his family (Acts 7:14-15a)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Where did Jacob and all his sons die? Answer – Egypt (Acts 7:15)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. What Old Testament deliverer was rejected by the people of Israel the first time he tried to save them?

Answer – Moses (Acts 7:25, 35; cp. Acts 7:52)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. For how many years was Moses an exile in Midian? Answer – 40 (Acts 7:30)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Who appeared to Moses in a flame of fire in a bush? *Answer – God, an angel (Acts 7:30-32)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Who spoke to Moses at Mt. Sinai? *Answer – The angel, God (Acts 7:38)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. During the exodus, who did "our fathers" thrust aside and refuse to obey? *Answer – Moses (Acts 7:39)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. What did Israel make and offer sacrifice to while Moses was gone for 40 days on Mt. Sinai? *Answer – A calf, the idol (Acts 7:40-41)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. What king of Israel asked to find a "dwelling place for the God of Jacob" (but was unable to do so)? *Answer – David (Acts 7:46)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. What king of Israel built a house for God, even though "God does not dwell in houses made by hands?" Answer – Solomon (Acts 7:47-48)

Who did Stephen accuse the Jewish council of betraying and murdering? *Answer* – "*The Righteous One", Jesus (Acts 7:52)*

What is being described when Acts 7 tells us that Stephen "fell asleep?" Answer – Stephen's death (Acts 7:60) Who is the first Christian martyr named in the book of Acts?

Answer – Stephen (Acts 7:60)

When Stephen was stoned to death, who was looking on with approval? *Answer – Saul (later called Paul) (Acts 8:1, cp. Acts 22:20)*

Who vigorously persecuted the church at Jerusalem after the death of Stephen? *Answer – Saul (later called Paul) (Acts 8:3); also Jews (cp. Acts 9:1-2)*

Acts 8. When the Ethiopian eunuch saw water by the road, what did he ask for? *Answer – Baptism (Acts 8:36)*

Acts 9. Why did Saul of Tarsus go to Damascus? *Answer – To arrest people of "The Way" (Acts 9:1-2)*

Acts 9. Who became a believer in Christ on the way to Damascus? *Answer – Saul of Tarsus (Acts 9:3ff)*

Acts 9. For how long was Saul blind after Jesus appeared to him on the Damascus Road? *Answer – Three days (Acts 9:8-9)*

Acts 9. What happened to Saul of Tarsus after Ananias came to him in Damascus?

[Get one base for each correct answer.]

Answer – (1) He received his sight (Acts 9:12, 17-18a); (2) Holy Spirit baptism (Acts 9:17); (3) Baptism to wash away his sins (Acts 9:18b, cp. Acts 22:16); (4) He received food, strength (Acts 9:19)

Acts 9. After his conversion, why did Saul have to escape from Damascus by being lowered from the wall in a basket?

[Get a single for any part of the answer; steal *third* with both parts.]

Answer – Jews were plotting to kill him (Acts 9:23); Jews were watching the gates day and night (Acts 9:24)

What Gentile is described in Acts 10 as "a devout man who feared God with all his household?" Answer – Cornelius (Acts 10:2)

Acts 10. An angel appeared to Cornelius while he was praying. Who did he tellCornelius to send for?Answer – Simon Peter (Acts 10:5-6)

Acts 10. What was Peter doing when three men arrived in Joppa to take him to Cornelius? *Answer – Praying (Acts 10:9)*

Acts 10. Where was Peter praying when three men arrived in Joppa to take him to Cornelius? *Answer – Housetop, house of Simon the tanner (Acts 10:9)*

Acts 10. While praying, Peter saw "something like a great sheet" let down from heaven. What was in the sheet?

[Get a base for each thing you can name.]

Answer – (1) Unclean animals, (2) reptiles, (3) birds (Acts 10:11-12, 14)

Acts 10. Peter had a vision of common and unclean animals. What did the visionprepare him for?Answer – Going to Cornelius, a Gentile (cp. Acts 10:20, 28)

Acts 10. Peter tells Cornelius all the things that God did for Jesus of Nazareth. Name them.

[Get a base for each thing you can name]

Answer – (1) Anointed him with the Holy Spirit and power (Acts 10:38), (2) Was with him / enabled him to do good, heal (Acts 10:38), (3) Raised him the third day (Acts 10:40), (4) Provided him with witnesses (Acts 10:39-42), (5) Appointed him judge of the living and dead (Acts 10:42).

Acts 10. Who has God appointed to be judge of both living and dead people? *Answer – Jesus of Nazareth (Acts 10:42)*

Acts 12. After killing the apostle James, what other apostle did Herod arrest and put in prison? *Answer – Peter (Acts 12:3)*

Acts 12. In what city was Peter imprisoned at Passover time? *Answer – Jerusalem (cp. Acts 11:2 with Acts 12:19, 25)*

Acts 12. Who was miraculously delivered from prison at Passover time? *Answer – Peter (Acts 12:4, 6ff)*

Acts 12. What did the church in Jerusalem do while Peter was in prison? *Answer* – (1) Pray for Peter (Acts 12:5), (2) Meet at the house of Mary, mother of John Mark (Acts 12:12)

Acts 12. Who delivered Peter from prison? Answer – An angel of the Lord, God, Lord, (Acts 12:7ff) Acts 12. What was the name of the servant girl who recognized Peter's voice at Mary's house, after he was released from prison? *Answer – Rhoda (Acts 12:13-14)*

Acts 12. Because he accepted worship from the people and did not give glory to God, what happened to king Herod?

Answer – Angel of the Lord struck him down, he died (Acts 12:23)

Who becomes the main apostle in the book of Acts after the story of Peter ends? *Answer – Saul (Paul) (Acts 12:25ff)*

Double Questions

Acts 1. What did Jesus talk to his apostles about after he rose from the dead?

[Start with a double; steal third with two answers; steal home with three answers.]

Answer – (1) Kingdom of God (Acts 1:3); (2) Remain at Jerusalem (Acts 1:4); (3) Holy Spirit baptism, Great Commission (Acts 1:5-8)

Acts 1. Where did Jesus order his apostles to stay until they were baptized with the Holy Spirit? *Answer – Jerusalem (Acts 1:4)*

What chapter of Acts records the Great Commission that Jesus gave his apostles before
ascending to heaven?Answer - 1 (Acts 1:8)

Acts 1. Where did all the disciples come from who saw Jesus ascend into heaven? *Answer – Galilee (Acts 1:11)*

Acts 1. Where did Jesus ascend to heaven from?

Answer – Mount of Olives (Acts 1:12)

Acts 1. About how many believers, in total, met in Jerusalem before Pentecost? *Answer – 120 (Acts 1:15)*

Acts 1. Name a believer (not an apostle) who met with the apostles in Jerusalem before Pentecost?

[Start with a double. Get an extra base for every extra believer you name.]

Answer – Mary the mother of Jesus, his brothers (James, Joseph, Simon, Judas – Matthew 13:55) (Acts 1:14), Joseph called Bar-sabbas (surnamed Justus), Matthias (Acts 1:23). What chapter of Acts tells about the selection of Matthias to replace Judas Iscariot as the 12^{th} apostle? Answer – 1 (Acts 1:15ff)

Acts 1. Who chose the 12th apostle to replace Judas Iscariot? *Answer – Jesus, the Lord (Acts 1:24-26a)*

Acts 1. Who became the 12th apostle in place of Judas Iscariot? *Answer – Matthias (Acts 1:26)*

In what chapter of Acts do we read about the Holy Spirit baptism of the apostles on the day of Pentecost? Answer 2 - (Acts 2:1-4ff)

[One title = a double. Steal third by naming both titles.]

Answer – Lord, Christ (Acts 2:36)

Acts 2. How many people were baptized on the day of Pentecost? *Answer – About 3,000 (Acts 2:41)*

Acts 2. In whose name were Jews baptized on the day of Pentecost? *Answer – Jesus Christ (Acts 2:38)*

Acts 2. For what were people baptized on the day of Pentecost? *Answer – Forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38)*

In what chapter of Acts do we read about a lame man who was healed at the Beautiful Gate of the Temple? Answer -3 (Acts 3:1-2ff)

Acts 4. What did the apostles publicly teach that greatly upset the priests and
Sadducees?Sadducees?Answer – Resurrection through Jesus (Acts 4:1-2)

By the time the lame man is healed at the Temple, how many believers are there in Jerusalem? Answer – About 5,000 (Acts 4:4)

Acts 4. When the Jewish rulers asked the apostles, "By what power or by what name did you (heal the lame man)," what did Peter tell them?

Answer – Jesus Christ of Nazareth (Acts 4:10)

Answer – (1) "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge" (Acts 4:19) (2) "We cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20) (3) "We must obey God rather than men." (Acts 5:29)

Acts 4. How old was the lame man that was healed at the Beautiful Gate of the Temple? *Answer – More than 40 (years old) (Acts 4:22)*

Acts 4. Where does this prophecy of the rejection of Christ come from? "Why did the heathen rage, and the people imagine vain things? The kings of the earth stood up, and the rulers were gathered together against the Lord, and against his Christ."

[Book = double; book and chapter = triple; book, chapter, and verses = home run.]

Answer – Psalms, Psalm 2, Psalm 2:1-2 (Acts 4:25 x-ref.)

Acts 4-5. What did the apostles do that caused people to pay attention to the things they preached?

Answer – "Great power", i.e., signs, wonders (Acts 4:33, cp. v.30 and Acts 5:12)

Acts 4. What Levite from Cyprus sold land and gave the money to the apostles? *Answer – Barnabas (Acts 4:36-37)*

[Steal third by answering this question:

What did he give the money to the apostles for?

Answer – The needy (Acts 4:34-35)]

What chapter of Acts tells the story of Ananias and Sapphira?

Answer – Acts 5 (Acts 5:1ff)

Acts 5. Ananias sold a piece of property and lied about the sale price. To whom did he lie? *Answer – The Holy Spirit (Acts 5:3); God (Acts 5:4); also the apostles (Acts 5:2-3)*

Acts 5. Ananias lies and dies. Three hours later, what does his wife do?

[Start with a double. Steal third with an extra answer.]

Answer – Comes to the apostles, lies (Acts 5:8-9); dies (Acts 5:10)

In early New Testament times, how did the people of Jerusalem regard the apostles of Jesus? *Answer – High esteem (Acts 5:13)*

Acts 5. The apostles do signs and wonders in Jerusalem. What do the people begin doing with their sick friends and relatives?

Answer – Lay them on cots and mats in the street to be healed (Acts 5:15-16)

Acts 5. The high priest and Sadducees arrest the apostles and put them in prison for a second time. What happens while the apostles are in prison? *Answer – An angel releases them during the night (Acts 5:17-19)*

Acts 5. The Jewish rulers beat the apostles and warn them for a second time not to speak in the name of Jesus. What do the apostles do?

Answer – Rejoice, keep preaching that Jesus = Christ! (Acts 5:41-42)

What chapter of Acts tells about seven faithful men (deacons) who were delegated by the apostles to oversee the relief of the needy in Jerusalem? Answer – 6 (Acts 6:1ff)

Acts 6. What did widows receive from the common fund of the Jerusalem church? *Answer – Daily food (Acts 6:1-2)*

Acts 6. What work did the apostles devote themselves to after turning over daily relief duties to seven other men?

[Start with a double for one answer. Go to third by giving both answers.]

Answer – Prayer, ministry of the word (Acts 6:4)

Acts 6. Seven faithful men were appointed to oversee the feeding of needy widows in Jerusalem. Name one of them who also preached the gospel.

[Name two and go to third base.]

Answer – Stephen (Acts 6:5 and 6:8-7:60); Philip (Acts 6:5 and 8:4-13, 26-40)

"Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and will change the customs that Moses delivered to us." Who was arrested in Jerusalem and accused of saying this? Answer – Stephen (Acts 6:14) What chapter of Acts records Stephen's defense before the Jewish council in Jerusalem? *Answer – 7 (Acts 7:1ff)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Stephen quotes God's promise to Abraham: "Go out from your land and from your kindred and go into the land that I will show you." Where is this promise first recorded in the Bible?

[Double = book; triple = book and chapter; home run = book chapter, and verse.]

Answer – Genesis 12:1 (Acts 7:3)

Answer – Mesopotamia (Acts 7:2); Ur of the Chaldees (Genesis 11:31; Acts 7:4)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. To whom did God promise "this land" (i.e., Canaan)?

[Start with a double for one answer. Go to third by giving both answers.]

Answer – (1) Him (Abraham); (2) His offspring (Acts 7:5)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. To whom was the covenant of circumcision first given? *Answer – Abraham (Acts 7:8, cp. Genesis 17:10)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Name one thing that happened the second time Joseph's brothers went to Egypt for food.

[Get a double for one answer. Go to third by giving both answers.]

Answer – (1) Joseph made himself known to his brothers; (2) Joseph's family became known to Pharaoh (Acts 7:13)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. How old was Moses when he was adopted by Pharaoh's daughter? Answer – Three months (Acts 7:20, cp. Exodus 2:1-2ff)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. What did Moses decide to do when he was 40 years old? *Answer – Visit his brothers, the children of Israel; save Israel (Acts 7:23-25)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Complete the statement that Moses made to Israel: "God will raise up for you a _____ like me from your brothers."

Answer – "Jesus of Nazareth" (Acts 2:22)


Acts 2. What Old Testament prophecy of the resurrection of Christ did Peter cite to the Jews in Jerusalem on the day of Pentecost?

Answer – Psalm 16, Psalm 16:8-11 (Acts 2:24-31)

Acts 2. What Old Testament prophecy of the ascension of Christ did Peter cite to the Jews in Jerusalem on the day of Pentecost?

Answer – Psalm 110, Psalm 110:1 (Acts 2:33-36)

Acts 3. In what part of the Temple did Peter preach to Jewish worshipers after the lame man was healed? *Answer – Solomon's Porch (Acts 3:11; cp. Acts 5:12)*



Acts 3. God sent Jesus to bless the Jews first. What is the blessing? *Answer* – "*Turn every one of you from your wickedness"* (Acts 3:26)

Acts 4. "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone?" Why did Peter cite this Old Testament prophecy and where is it found? *Answer – The Jewish "builders" had rejected Jesus, Psalm 118 (Acts 4:11, see x-ref)*

Acts 4. What is the meaning of the name Barnabas? Answer – Son of Consolation, Son of Encouragement, Son of Rest (Acts 4:36) Acts 5. When the Jewish council warns the apostles a second time not to preach in the name of Jesus, what does Peter tell them?

Answer - "We must obey God rather than men." (Acts 5:29)

Acts 4-6. You are a member of the Jewish council that puts the apostles and Stephen on trial. Name one miraculous thing that you see during these trials that ought to change your mind about rejecting Jesus of Nazareth.

Answer – Healed lame man standing with the apostles (Acts 4:14); Stephen's physical appearance (face like an angel) (Acts 6:15); also consider the miraculous release of the apostles from prison (Acts 5:17-26)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Where was the burning bush located? Be specific. *Answer – In the wilderness of Mt. Sinai (Acts 7:30);* "*The west side of the wilderness, (at) Horeb, the mountain of God" (Cp. Exodus 3:1)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. What Old Testament prophet does Stephen cite when he tells the Jewish council that Israel went into captivity because of idolatry? *Answer – Amos, Amos 5:25-27 (Acts 7:42-43 x-ref)*

Acts 8. Peter and John were sent from Jerusalem to Samaria. What did they pray for when they got there? *Answer – Holy Spirit baptism of the believers (Acts 8:14-17)*

Acts 8. What did Simon the sorcerer need to repent of *after* his baptism? *Answer – Wickedness, the intent of his heart, iniquity, etc. (Acts 8:21-23, cp. Acts 8:13)*

Acts 8. Where did Philip preach the gospel after baptizing the Ethiopian eunuch?

[Stop at third base if either place is named but not "all the towns".]

Answer – "All the towns" from Azotus to Caesarea (Acts 8:40)

Acts 9. What impact did the conversion of Saul of Tarsus have on the body of believers in Judea, Samaria, and Galilee?

[Give at least two parts of the answer for a home run. Otherwise stop at third.]

Answer – Peace, built up, encouragement / comfort, growth (Acts 9:31)

Acts 10. Peter and the apostles testified about everything that God did through Jesus of Nazareth. According to Peter, who else testifies about Jesus? *Answer* – "*All the prophets" (Acts 10:43)*

Acts 11. When it became known to the disciples in Antioch of Syria that widespread famine was imminent, what did they do?

Answer – Send relief for the believers in Judea (Acts 11:29)

Acts 11. What convinced Jewish believers in Jerusalem that Gentile believers are acceptable to God?

Answer – Peter's words: "God gave the same gift to them as he gave to us"; i.e., Holy Spirit baptism (Acts 11:17-18)

Acts 11. In what foreign city did believers from Cyprus and Cyrene begin preaching to Hellenists (Greek speaking people)? *Answer – Antioch (of Syria) (Acts 11:20-21)*

Acts 12. At what time of year did Herod kill the apostle James and arrest Peter? Answer – Unleavened Bread, Passover (Acts 12:3-4)

Acts 12. When Peter realized that he was actually free from prison, where did he go? Answer – House of Mary, mother of John Mark (Acts 12:12)

Extra Questions

Acts 1. How did Jesus give instruction to his apostles before he ascended to heaven? *Answer – By the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:2)*

What is baptism of the Holy Spirit called in Acts 1? Answer – "The promise of the Father" (Acts 1:4)

What did the apostles wait in Jerusalem for after Jesus ascended to heaven? *Answer – Baptism of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:5)*

Acts 1. What does the Father control that apostles (and other men) do not to know? *Answer – Times, seasons (Acts 1:7)*

Whose witnesses did the apostles become after they were baptized with the Holy Spirit? *Answer – Jesus's (Acts 1:8)*

Acts 1. What did the apostles do while they waited in Jerusalem for Pentecost? *Answer – Pray earnestly (Acts 1:14)*

What occupation did Judas Iscariot forfeit by betraying Jesus? *Answer* – "*His share in this ministry" (Acts 1:17)*

What was the field called that Judas purchased with the reward of his wickedness? *Answer – Akeldama or "Field of Blood" (Acts 1:18-19)*

On what day were the 12 apostles baptized with the Holy Spirit? *Answer – Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1)*

What did the Holy Spirit empower the apostles to do on the day of Pentecost?

Answer – Speak in tongues (Acts 2:4)

Acts 2, Pentecost. What hour of the day was it when the apostles spoke to the Jewish people in tongues? *Answer – Third hour (Acts 2:15)*

Acts 2, Pentecost. According to Peter, what did God do through Jesus of Nazareth? *Answer – Mighty works, wonders, signs (Acts 2:22)*

Complete the Old Testament prophecy, quoted by Peter on the day of Pentecost: "You will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let you Holy One see _____."

Answer – "Corruption" (Acts 2:27)

Acts 3. How did the Jewish people respond when they saw the lame man with Peter and John in the Temple?

Answer – Filled with awe, wonder; ran together to them (Acts 3:10-11)

The apostles cite Psalm 2 in Acts 4: "Why did the heathen rage, and the people imagine vain things? The kings of the earth stood up, and the rulers were gathered together against the Lord, and against his Christ." What Old Testament prophet said this? *Answer – David (Acts 4:25)*

In Acts 4, after the apostles prayed, what happened that empowered them to continue speaking the word of God with boldness?

Answer – They were filled with the Holy Spirit (Acts 4:31)

Acts 4. Why did believers, like Barnabas, sell property and give the money to the apostles? *Answer – To help the needy (Acts 4:34-35)*

What Hebrew name did Barnabas also go by?

Answer – Joses, Joseph (Acts 4:36)

Acts 5. What did Ananias and Sapphira do that Barnabas also did? Name one thing. *Answer – Sell a piece of property (cp. Acts 5:1 with Acts 4:37); bring the money to the apostles (cp. Acts 5:2 with Acts 4:37)*

Acts 5. When both sold pieces of property, what did Ananias and Sapphira do that Barnabas did not do?

Answer – Keep back part of the money and lie about it (cp. Acts 5:2-4 with Acts 4:37)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense.After leaving the land of the Chaldeans, where did Abrahamlive until his father died?Answer – Haran (Act 7:4; cp. Genesis 11:31-32)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. For how long were Abraham's offspring sojourners in a land that belonged to others? *Answer – 400 years (Acts 7:6)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. What did God tell Abraham that He would do to the nation that enslaved his offspring? *Answer – Judge them (Acts 7:7; cp. Genesis 15:14)*

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. How old was Isaac when he was circumcised? *Answer – 8 days (Acts 7:8, cp. Genesis 21:4)*

Joseph's brothers did not know who he was until they met him the second time. Who is Joseph a type of? *Answer – Jesus (Acts 7:13; cp. Zechariah 12:10 and 13:6).*

Answer – In a flame of fire in a bush (Acts 7:30)

Acts 7, Stephen's defense. Identify one thing that God said to Moses when He spoke to him out of the burning bush. Answer – (Acts 7:32-34)

Acts 8. In whose name did Philip baptize the believing men and women of Samaria? *Answer* – "*The Lord Jesus"* (Acts 8:16)

Acts 8. How did Samaritan believers receive Holy Spirit baptism? Answer – Prayer, laying on of hands (Acts 8:15-17)

Acts 8. Complete Peter's words to Simon the sorcerer: "May your silver perish with you, because you thought you could obtain _____ with money!"

Answer – "The gift of God" (Acts 8:20)

Acts 8. After preaching in the city of Samaria, what did Peter and John do? Name one thing.

Answer – (1) Return to Jerusalem; (2) Preach in many Samaritan villages (Acts 8:25)

Acts 8. After preaching in Samaria, how did Philip know where to go next? *Answer – An angel of the Lord spoke to him (Acts 8:26)*

Acts 8. To whom did Philip preach the gospel after leaving Samaria? *Answer – Ethiopian eunuch (Acts 8:26ff)*

Acts 8. What occupation did the Ethiopian eunuch have in his native country? *Answer – Court treasurer (Acts 8:27)*

Acts 8. What is the missing word in this Isaiah passage: "Like a _____ he was led to the slaughter." he was led to *Answer* – "*Sheep"* (Acts 8:32)

Acts 9. To what city was Saul of Tarsus going when Jesus appeared to him in blinding light? *Answer – Damascus (Acts 9:3)*

Acts 9. What question did Saul ask Jesus after Jesus called him on the Damascus Road? *Answer* – "*Who are you, Lord?" (Acts 9:5)*

Acts 9. What impact did Saul's conversion have on the Jews of Damascus?

Answer – Amazed, confounded (Acts 9:21-22)


Acts 9. What did the Jews of Damascus do after Saul preached there for "many days"? *Answer – Plot to kill him (Acts 9:23)*

Acts 10. At what hour of the day was Peter praying on the housetop at the house of Simon the tanner? *Answer – Sixth hour (Acts 10:9)*

Acts 10, when Peter saw animals let down from heaven. Complete the words that Peter heard: "Rise, Peter, _____." *Answer* – "*Kill and eat"* (Acts 10:13)

Acts 10, when Peter saw animals let down from heaven. Peter protested that he had never eaten what? *Answer – Anything common, unclean (Acts 10:14)*

Answer – Death of Stephen, persecution following Stephen's death (Acts 11:19)

Acts 11. When Jewish believers were scattered from Jerusalem after the death of Stephen, who did they initially preach the gospel to? *Answer – Jews only (Acts 11:19)*

Acts 11. How did the disciples in Antioch of Syria become aware that widespreadfamine was imminent?Answer – Prophets from Jerusalem (Acts 11:27-28)Answer – The prophet Agabus (Acts 11:28)

Acts 12. What ruler of Judea was responsible for the murder of the apostle James? *Answer – Herod (Herod Agrippa I) (Acts 12:1-2)*

Two soldiers, two chains, and sentries at the door. Whose imprisonment does this describe? *Answer – Peter's (Acts 12:6)*

Acts 12. At what time of day was Peter miraculously released from prison? *Answer – Night, Peter was sleeping (Acts 12:6)*
