

## Focus Points



| ___ 1 – ASSYRIA   | A – Besieged and conquered by Sennacherib's army just before the siege of Jerusalem. Part of the Assyrian conquest of Judah (2 Kings 18:13-14). |
| ___ 2 – DAMASCUS  | B – Besieged by the Assyrians in the days of King Hezekiah but saved by God, c.701 B.C. (2 Kings 18:17; 2 Kings 19:32-35).                      |
| ___ 3 – SAMARIA   | C – Capital of the Assyrian Empire (2 Kings 19:36).   |
| ___ 4 – BABYLON   | D – Capital of the northern kingdom of Israel, conquered by the Assyrians, c.722 B.C. (2 Kings 18:9-12).  |
| ___ 5 – HAMATH    | E – Conquered by the Assyrians in the days of King Ahaz, Hezekiah's Father (2 Kings 16:8-9).  |
| ___ 6 – LACHISH   | F – One of many cities whose gods were powerless to save them from the Assyrians (2 Kings 18:33-35).  |
| ___ 7 – JERUSALEM | G – One of many foreign places from which people were brought to Samaria after it was conquered by the Assyrians (2 Kings 17:24).               |
| ___ 8 – NINEVEH   | H – Where Israelites and Jews were deported in the days of King Hezekiah (2 Kings 17:22-23 and the Sennacherib prisms).                         |
