- 1535. First complete printed 1. Bible in the English language. 1539. First English "authorized 2. version" (by Henry VIII) for use in the Church of England. 1560. Bible of protestant exiles, produced during the reign of Mary I. Bible of the Puritans. 1568. Replaced the Great Bible as the Bible of the English Church during the reign of Elizabeth I. 1582/1609. Roman Catholic counter-reformation Bible, translated from the Latin Vulgate. 1611. "Authorized" to replace the Bishops' Bible in the Church of England. 1881/1885. First major English revision since KJV, based on older manuscripts. 8. 1901. First English translation produced in the United States of America. 1946/1952. American revision of the ASV. 10. 1978. "Thought for thought" translation in modern English. 11. 1982. Literal translation in modern English patterned after 12. 2001. "Essentially literal" translation based on the earlier RSV.
